

How to Prepare for Midterms

Midterms can be stressful and are often the most dreaded events on a student's calendar. Even with exams around the corner, the following strategies can help students prepare effectively.

The Five Day Study Plan: An active study strategy used to plan out how much time one spends previewing and self-testing over the five days preceding an exam.

Pomodoro Method: A self-paced plan of when to take breaks and when to study which splits study sessions into manageable periods.

Feynman Technique: The ability to teach someone else a topic with accuracy, which deepens one's own understanding of a concept.
