In the 2024-2025 academic year, students participated in painting workshops, visited with dogs, volunteered at the Ronald McDonald House, and much more!














## Pizza with F1RST


## **Study Lounge Updates**

The Center for Academic Learning Support, located in MAIN Suite 206, provides a variety of support resources and information for first-generation students and families.

The F1RST Program is open to any student who would like to connect with a community of first-gen students and be proactively connected to support and information. F1RST classes are 0-credit hour, 50-minute per week classes that offer students a community of support.
