




# First-Gen Celebration Week

# First-Gen Spotlight: Kasey Coulson

Howdy! My name is Kasey, and I am a senior in Marine Biology set to graduate in December of this year. My passion for biology and research began during my childhood and strengthened throughout my years in academia, influencing my choice of a career immersed in wildlife. Being a part of the Aggie Research Scholars Program for over a year, I have studied the invasive behavior of the Italian Wall lizard through the BORIS software.

Recently, I have been given the honor of studying the morphometrics of the Italian Wall lizard, which has deepened my understanding of behavioral ecology and genetics. Beyond working with the university, I gained practical field and data analysis experience as a Research Intern with the Fort Worth Botanical Gardens (Botanical Research Institute of Texas). In this role, I collected Texas native plants for the BRIT Herbarium, assisted park rangers with invasive species management, and utilized GPS technology and mapping tools.

As a first-generation student, earning this degree is not only a personal accomplishment but also a tribute to my family. I want to complete my education to give back to my parents and to show others that being the first in your family to pursue higher education is something to be proud of, not ashamed of.
