


- On Sunday, August 10, the halls and some rooms of the Texas A&M Maritime Academy Hall (TAMMAH) was filled with just over 200 new cadets and families for the beginning of the 2025 Fall O-week. For a week, these new cadets moved into TAMMAH to begin their journey into the Corps of Cadets. Events during this week included general presentation about campus and Corps' resources, training sessions, visiting the TS Kennedy and spending time in the DC simulator. - On August 25, with the start of the Fall semester, the Corps of Cadets began operations.






# TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY GALVESTON CAMPUS.

- 119 check ins since the start of the semester with an even spread between mental health counseling, career counseling, accommodations and relaxation room usage.
- We had a record-breaking blood drive with 76 total donations during Gig
   'Em Week!
- Gig 'Em Guidepost had 193 confirmed check ins, but we estimate around 220 total points of contact made with students starting the semester. We provided giveaways, answered questions and made valuable connections!





### **Facilities**

- New equipment for SAFC, Multi-Purpose Room, and Cardio & Recovery Room delivered on 8/28 including new cardio equipment, massage chair, sauna, and weight equipment.
- Facility staff training took place on Saturday 8/23. All staff were trained or retrained in daily operations and everyone was trained on our new software, Connect2Concepts.
- New facilities staff attended CPR training on Sunday, 8/24.
- The Campus Recreation Center and the Sea Aggie Fitness Center have both reopened for the fall semester. We are already seeing high numbers of access.
- Equipment available for student check out has been updated and added into circulation.

### **Green Dot**

- 4 Green Dot Overviews were given to Salt Camp staff as a part of their staff training.
- The Green Dot Team hosted a successful Gig'em Week event, in partnership with Aggie Dining. Aggie dining donated free iced coffee to students, and we facilitated first day of school photos while educating students about green dot, promoting upcoming cadet overviews and our org. incentive.

## **New Student Conference**

total, our Orientation Transition Leader staff and dozens of faculty
and staff worked with 280 incoming students, many of whom were
transferring from another institution or who were arriving from
overseas to campus for the first time. Our Orientation Leader Staff
led fun activities in the evening that allowed first year students to get
to know one another and also hosted a tour of campus for these
students that gave them a chance to find where important campus
resources were located.



## **Howdy Week**

• Our annual Howdy Week was held from August 21-23 in which 430 students participated in a wide variety of activities designed to help educate them about campus and its resources. Howdy Week is an opportunity for all first-year students to move to campus early and participate in activities in partnership with our academic departments, Center for Academic Learning Support, and the Division of Student Affairs that helped to prepare them as they start their first semester of college. Students had an opportunity to learn the structure of academics in college and how to utilize a syllabus. They also heard from a variety of professionals with counseling and career services and campus living and learning about life as an independent college student and how to find resources to best advocate for their needs. This was all done in an environment where there were no classes or homework, meaning that their sole focus was to familiarize themselves with the campus and be prepared to hit the ground running for their first day of college.

## **Howdy Week Service Project**

We had an outstanding turn out when it came to outside organizations and businesses signing up to be sites for
this year's Howdy Week Service Project. With 23 sites (and 4 on the waitlist), we could provide 430 students to
these sites. Unfortunately, due to weather, we were unable to send the students out, but with the help from the Big
Event officer team, we are working to send students out to these sites and still have the projects completed this
fall!



# **Officer Training**

On August 25th, a total of 478 student officers representing 86 student organizations
participated in an in-person training session. The training covered key topics, including risk
management, financial management, and the resources provided by the Office of Student
Activities.

# Org. Night

 On August 28th, 855 students enthusiastically participated in Organizations Night, held in the ASEC Ballroom. The event featured approximately 90 tables hosted by student organizations, and local Galveston volunteer groups, non-profits, and churches. Attendees had the opportunity to explore various avenues for campus involvement and community engagement. The evening's highlights included a yell practice and a performance by the Two-Step Team.

#### **Fall Firsts**

During the first two weeks of the semester, organization presidents and treasurers have been completing their online training through Get Involved. As students finalize their training, they are preparing to host their initial meetings and events for the semester. Notable upcoming events include the Student Government Association's first senate meeting, Sea Aggie Pride's inaugural Mugdown event before Midnight Yell where students can enjoy coffee and snacks before the evening's festivities, and preparations for Two-Step's tryouts.








## Gig 'Em Week
